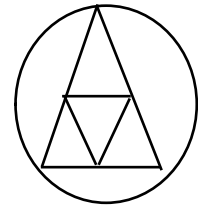

YOUR RIGHT TO VOTE

Most of us do not have the money to buy or the political power to affect or influence the operation of our city, county, state and federal government. What we do have is the power to determine who will make those decisions for us. It is called the RIGHT AND POWER OF THE VOTE. One-person-one vote. All votes are equal. Before you can vote, you must register to vote in the city and or county in which you live. In Starkville its the City Clerks Office. You must also register in the county's Circuit Clerks office to vote in county, state, and federal elections. In Starkville, the office is located in the new Court House Annex. We have an election on November 7, 2006 for United State Senate. Erik Fleming, Democrat is opposing Trent Lott, Republican. Also Circuit Court Judges are on the November 7 ballot, Judge Jim Kitchens is opposed by Attorney Roy Perkins.
